We have had another complaint from residents about driveways being blocked. We always ask those complaining to take registration numbers and call the police. I feel that blocking driveways is not particularly dangerous but it's still not acceptable and anyone doing so is committing an offence.

On that note, I was startled to see a police officer at our Nursery door the other day. He had come about an alleged dangerous driving incident one morning last week. For all I know it might be completely unrelated to our school or even any school – the police officer was not particularly forthcoming.

Dangerous parking and driving risks the lives of all the children in the three schools near the crossroads. It causes innocent drivers to have to make risky decisions to avoid other cars or because they can't see traffic as their view is blocked by a person who has parked dangerously.

I am sure I am not alone in thinking that both dangerous parking and driving are a police matter and would encourage all of the community to keep our children safe and to drive and park sensibly for our children's safety.

I would recommend reporting offences directly to the police with registration numbers in order to make sure we stamp out dangerous driving from Blythe High, Forsbrook and William Amory.
